Why Call When You Can Text?

For any <u>non-urgent</u>, <u>non-critical communication</u>, you can text the hospitalist assigned to the physician at any given time.

Example: <next of kin wants to speak with you>

| Mobile Heartbeat Workflow Examples | | | |
|------------------------------------|--|--|--|
| Sender | Receiver | Purpose | Next step |
| Provider (e.g. ED physician) | Provider (e.g. Hospitalist) | New consult, admission, or transfer | Provider returns acknowledgement |
| Provider | Case Manager | Inquire about SNF transfer | Case manager responds with time or additional DC needs |
| Leader | Unit Staff | Broadcast to announce in-service or other meeting | As needed |
| Pharmacist | Provider | Medication substitution or clarification, anti- microbial stewardship | Provider to enter order in CPOE (or <u>call</u> pharmacist to give orders) |
| Pharmacist | Provider | Drug shortage, formulary change, substitutes | Courtesy, as needed |
| Nurse | Nurse Tech, Nurse, or Charge Nurse | Assistance needed | Immediately reports to room, or confirms availability |
| Nurse | Resp Therapist | PRN breathing treatment needed | RT confirmation to provide treatment |
