

"Interventions at birth" has been revised to be more specific. This new query will be added to Neonatology and Newborn provider notes.



# SPONTANEOUS BREATHING TRIAL (Category Change ONLY)

Changes go in effect Nov 19, 2025



The Spontaneous Breathing Trial order (SPONBRETRI.C.OM) is in the OM Category of "Nursing". For this order, the Respiratory Therapy team assesses ability to breathe with minimal or no vent support. RT documents the findings in the "RT Ventilator Weaning" intervention (12205611). Since this order is under the Category of "Nursing", it currently does not notify RT of the new order. It will be changed to the Category of "Respiratory OM", to correct the issue. NO OTHER CHANGES to this order. These changes were made in collaboration with the Corporate RT and Provider Product teams.

#### Status Boards: Actionable Provider Fields

New functionality is available which allows users to view provider contact information from the status board.



On the patient care status board, click the name of the patient's admitting, attending, or responsible provider.




If the provider's office phone number has been loaded into the system, it will display in the overlay.

Click Close to exit the overlay.




#### **Updates to Nursing Status Boards**








The dedicated status board fields for Temp Location, Preferred Name, Pronouns, and Confidential will be removed from the nursing status board for inpatient nurses, W&C nurses, and IPR nurses.



The lowercase 'c' confidential flag will continue to be seen next to patient names on confidential records.

The 'conf' flag will also continue to display in the reference region of the patient's chart.



If the patient has a documented preferred name, pronouns, or temporary location, these will also remain visible in the reference region of their chart.
