

# MEDITECH Expanse TIP SHEET

## Maternal drug use documentation

PC-06: Unexpected Complications in Term Newborns is a quality measure that is designed to assess the health outcomes of term newborns. Variances are reported to The Joint Commission (TJC).

Maternal drug and medication use can be an exclusion to PC-06 and needs to be documented in both mom and newborns chart.

New queries will be added to nursing and provider documentation for OB to capture maternal drug and medication use during pregnancy that align with the PC-06 exclusion criteria.

Coder abstraction can occur from progress notes but typically is taken from provider admission and discharge diagnoses.

Listing maternal medications, conditions, and illicit drug use only in the maternal history will not be coded.

Information must be in the infant diagnosis, history, or assessment section of the notes.

OB Hydralazine for Hypertension

Condition	Dose/Route	Instruction
If SBP $\geq$ 160 or DBP $\geq$ 11...	5 mg IV Once hydrALAZINE	Give over 2 minutes. Repeat BP in 20 minutes
If no IV access	10 mg PO Once nifedipine	Repeat blood pressure in 20 minutes
After 5 mg dose hydrALAZINE, i...	10 mg IV Once hydrALAZINE	Give over 2 minutes. Repeat BP in 20 minutes
After 10 mg dose hydrALAZINE...	20 mg IV Once labetalol	Give over 2 minutes. Repeat BP in 10 minutes
After 20 mg dose labetalol, if S...	40 mg IV Once labetalol	Give over 2 minutes. Repeat BP in 10 minutes
After 40 mg dose labetalol, if S...	----->	Obtain emergency consultation

Protocol Text

If protocol is initiated, notify provider after the 1st dose is administered.  
Notify provider to re-order the protocol when BP is within normal limits (SBP < 160 mmHg AND DPB <110 mmHg) x 2.

OB Labetalol for Hypertension

Condition	Dose/Route	Instruction
If SBP $\geq$ 160 or DBP $\geq$ 11...	20 mg IV Once Labetalol	Give over 2 minutes. Repeat BP in 10 minutes
If no IV access	10 mg PO Once nifedipine	Repeat BP in 20 minutes
After 20 mg dose, if SBP $\geq$ 1...	40 mg IV Once Labetalol	Give over 2 minutes. Repeat BP in 10 minutes
After 40 mg dose, if SBP $\geq$ 1...	80 mg IV Once Labetalol	Give over 2 minutes. Repeat BP in 10 minutes
After 80 mg dose, if SBP $\geq$ 1...	10 mg IV Once hydrALAZINE	Give over 2 minutes. Repeat BP in 20 minutes
After 10 mg dose hydrALAZINE ...	----->	Obtain emergency consultation

## Intraoperative:

### Prep Site

A prep site is needed when using the Prep Site intervention. 12 different Prep Sites can be used.

‘Povidone-iodine plus isopropyl alcohol’ and ‘Nonantimicrobial soap’ are listed options in the Prep solution field.
